October, Tuesday 18th to Saturday 22nd, 2016

The Educational sessions will be held in St. Luke's Hospital, Highfield Road, Rathgar, Dublin 6 on Tuesday 18th. The meeting will be held on Wednesday 19th to Saturday 22nd at The Convention Centre, Spencer Dock, North Wall Quay, Dublin 1, Ireland.

The topic for Tuesday will be an educational day on the state of the art in stereotactic radiation technologies hosted by St. Luke's Hospital. On Wednesday 19th updates on current trials in Europe and North America will be addressed including new approaches in treatment planning. On Thursday 20th, new concepts for medulloblastoma, Wilms tumours and advances in proton therapy will be presented. On Friday 21st, during then ongoing SIOP meeting multidisciplinary session with the International Society of Paediatric Surgical Oncology (IPSO) will address local management in Neuroblastoma. A PROS symposium will address the management of spinal tumours.

The Book of Kells is an illustrated manuscript created by Irish monks circa. 800 AD. and Dublin Castle dates back to 1204 AD. This city is as old as it is new! This year we are commemorating the 1916 Easter Rising which was a significant battle in our struggle for independence. 1916 tours are available and they usually take in the Kilamainham Gaol. The Gaol is worth a visit in itself. What a great year to have PROS/SIOP in Dublin!

Please take time to visit the sites or relax in one of the many famed traditional pubs by engaging in "craic agus ceol"- fun and music! The Temple Bar area contains a higher than average pub and restaurant ratio, and additionally is the location of many Irish cultural institutions, including the Irish Photography Centre, the Ark Children's Cultural Centre and the Irish Film Institute. Dublin is also a UNESCO city of literature so remember to say hello to the statue of Oscar Wilde or pop in the Abbey Theatre which is the national theatre of Ireland, founded in 1904 by W.B. Yeats and Lady Gregory 'to bring upon the stage the deeper emotions of Ireland'. In addition, the Dublin Writers Museum is available if you want full literary immersion. If you are after some shopping make sure to visit Grafton Street and the surrounding area for high street and high end fashion. Like most cities, the food scene has undergone some changes in the last few years and the best up to date recommendations are online.
